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Background

- **The National Education Act B.E 2542 (1999)**
- **Boromarajonani College of Nursing, Phaypao designed the teaching and learning process focused on humanized care.**
- **Four competencies: holistic care, thinking skill, systemic solving skill and ethical and moral care behaviors.**

 - 4. Family and Community Nursing Practicum 1**



Background

- The new graduate nurses of academic year 2010 were students who attending the humanistic curriculum.
- The perception of those students toward humanized care



objectives

- 1. To explore the relationship between humanistic caring behaviors and characteristic of humanistic nurses on the perception of new graduate nurses.**
- 2. To determine relationship between humanistic caring behaviors and the use of nursing process for nursing practice on the perception of new graduate nurses.**



Hypothesis.

- 1. Humanistic caring behaviors would relate with characteristic of humanistic nurses.**
- 2. Humanistic caring behaviors would relate with the use of nursing process for nursing practice.**

Methodology

- **140 new graduate nurses of academic year 2010, Boromarajonani College of Nursing, Phayao.**
- **Self-reported questionnaire**
- **Reliability of questionnaire was .95.**
- **Statistics:**
 - Descriptive statistic**
 - Pearson's chi-square**

 - the ability of adaptation of nursing implementation to fit with client context
 - ability to use knowledge for planning and implementation which results in problem solving skill under client context.
